


## WARD PROFILES

A step by step guide for sourcing custom ward 2011 Census data from the Official Labour Market Statistics (NOMIS) and the Office for National Statistics (ONS).

### [NOMIS 'Ward 2011 Census Statistics'](#)

**Step 1:** Click <https://www.nomisweb.co.uk/>

The link will take you to the NOMIS page located on the ONS website, as shown below.



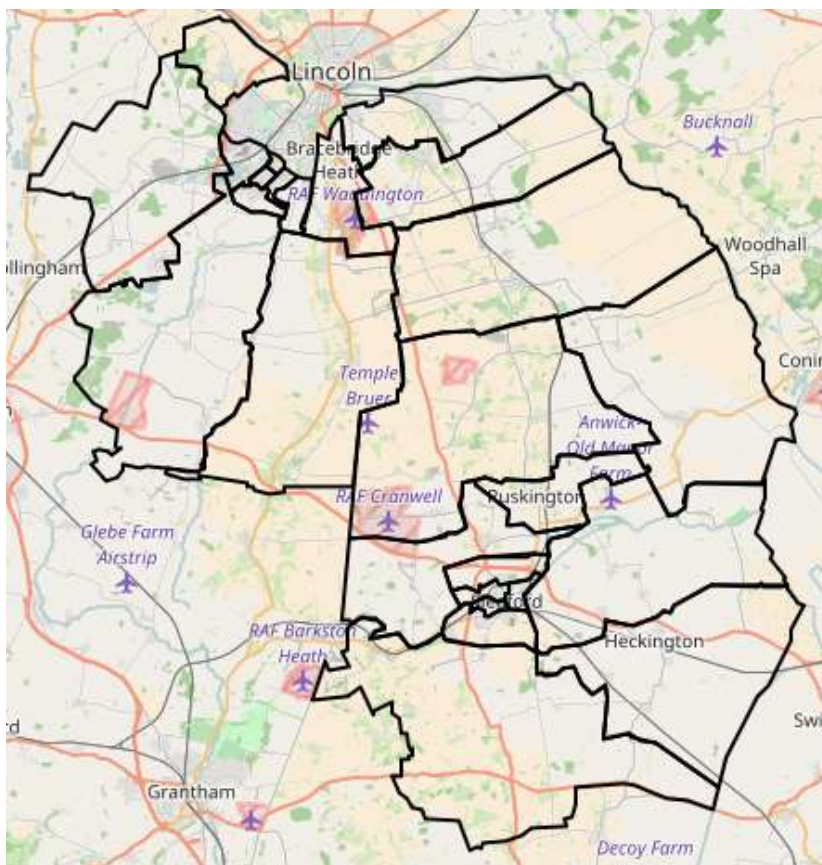

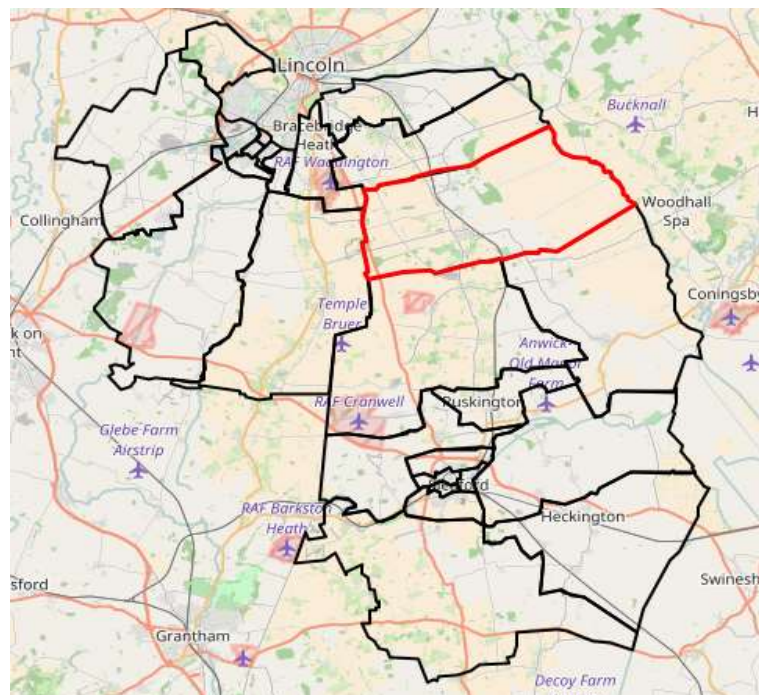
