The site is allocated for development in the adopted Central Lincolnshire Local Plan (April 2017) to deliver a total of 3,500 new homes by 2036, with further potential to deliver a total of 6,000 dwellings. The SEQ will also see the development of a District Centre and Local Centre, as well as 7 hectares of new employment land, and the provision of several new primary and secondary schools.

NKDC have prepared a draft Design Code for the SEQ. The Design Code is a document which illustrates a set of detailed design principles for the design of the new homes, community facilities and open space at the SEQ.
