1 Introduction

Introduction

- 1.1** The Central Lincolnshire Local Plan has been prepared in accordance with the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012. This statement demonstrates how the Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee (CLJSPC) has involved the public and its key partners in the preparation of the Local Plan, in accordance with the Regulations and the Committee's adopted Statement of Community Involvement (2014).
- 1.2** This Consultation Statement is prepared in accordance with Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 which requires, inter alia, the publication (as part of a package of documents which collectively make up the 'Proposed Submission Document' s as defined by Regulation 17) of a statement setting out:

*“(i) which bodies and persons were invited to make representations under regulation 18,
(ii) how those bodies and persons were invited to make such representations,
(iii) a summary of the main issues raised by those representations, and
(iv) how those main issues have been addressed in the DPD”*

(note: for the avoidance of doubt, 'DPD' above stands for Development Plan Document. A Local Plan is a form of DPD, and in essence the two phrases are interchangeable)

Central Lincolnshire Local Plan

- 1.3** There is no current Local Plan for Central Lincolnshire. At present, the development plan for the area (excluding Minerals and Waste matters) comprises the adopted Local Plans for Lincoln, West Lindsey and North Kesteven. These three plans will be superseded in their entirety on adoption of the central Lincolnshire Local Plan.
- 1.4** Originally, it was intended to prepare a 'Core Strategy' Local Plan, followed by a 'Site Allocations' Local Plan, but this approach was abandoned following events in late 2013. In March 2014, it was decided to commence a single Local Plan for the area.

Statement of Community Involvement (SCI)

- 1.5** In addition to national Acts and Regulations governing consultation arrangements on an emerging Local Plan, the CLJSPC also adopted an SCI on 12 May 2014. The commitments made in that SCI must be followed through (unless there are legal reasons to the contrary, such as a change in national Regulations).

Summary of community and stakeholder engagement on the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan

- 1.6** The CLJSPC agreed a three stage consultation process to preparing the Local Plan, together with a timetable for doing so (see the Local Development Scheme for the timetable).
- 1.7** The three consultation stages proposed, which have been followed through on, were:

- Preliminary Draft Local Plan – which was consulted upon Oct-Nov 2014
- Further Draft Local Plan – which was consulted upon Oct-Nov 2015
- Proposed Submission Local Plan – scheduled for consultation Apr-May 2016

1.8 The Preliminary Draft and the Further Draft were both undertaken under the 'Regulation 18' requirements, though as will be seen in this statement, consultation which took place at these stages were considerably greater than the legal minimum requirement as set by Regulation 18.

Duty to cooperate

1.9 Prescribed public bodies have a duty to cooperate on planning issues that cross administrative boundaries. A separate *Statement of Compliance with the Duty to Cooperate* (April 2016) is available on our website.

Structure of this Consultation Statement

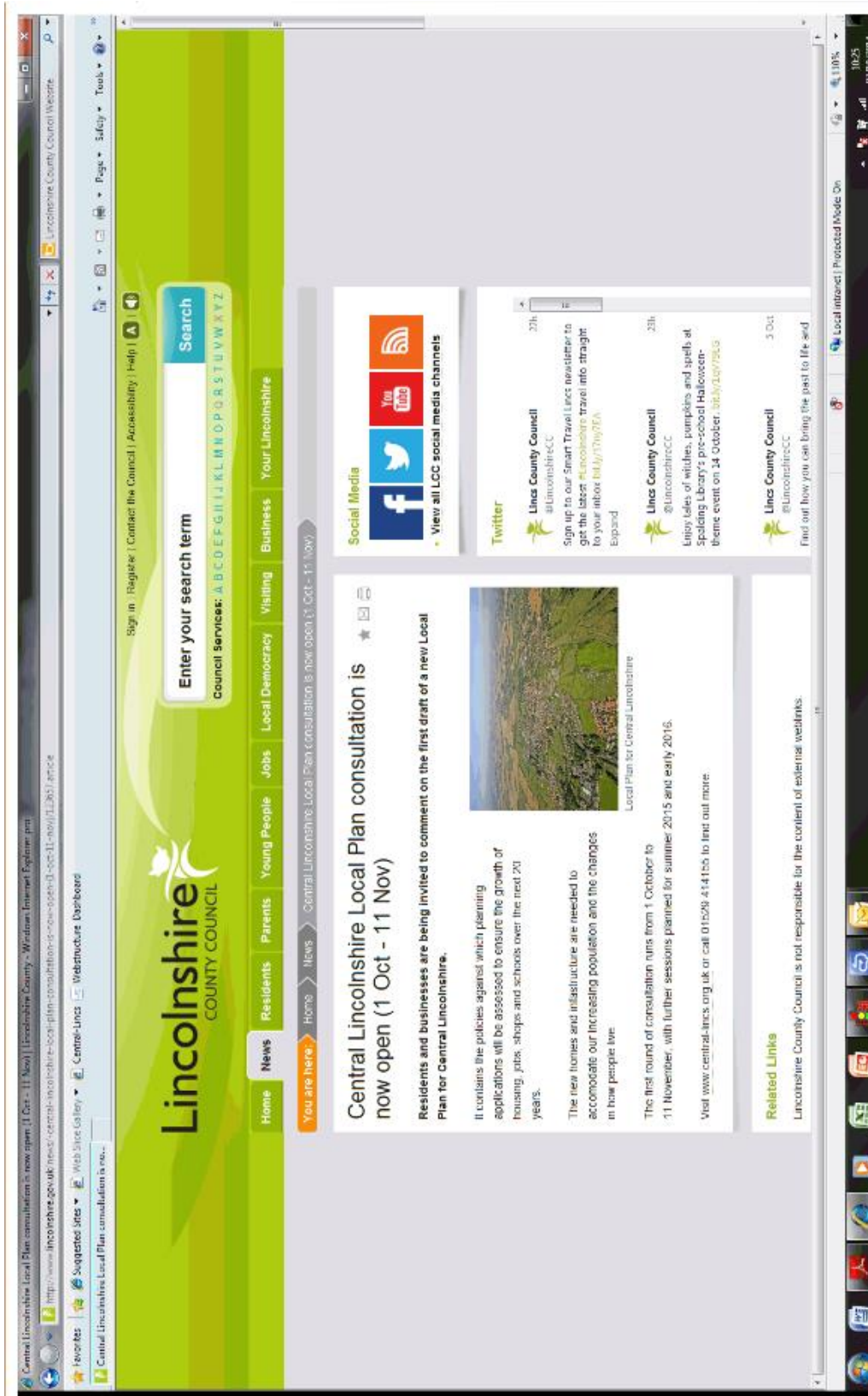

Lincoln residents' opinions still wanted on new Local Plan



Councillor Jeff Summers (Leader of West Lindsey District Council), Councillor Ric Metcalfe (Leader of City of Lincoln Council) and Councillor Marion Brighton OBE (Leader of North Kesteven District Council).

Lincoln residents' opinions on the Preliminary Draft Local Plan for the Central Lincolnshire area for guiding new houses, jobs, shops and schools are still welcome.

The draft plan by the Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee will map out where homes and amenities in the Lincoln, Gainsborough and Sleaford areas for the next 20 years.

The consultation period started at the beginning of October with a number of events, but people can still have their say in writing or online.

This first consultation is an opportunity for residents, businesses and organisations to comment on the overarching idea, which will guide the way planning applications are considered by North Kesteven, West Lindsey and the City of Lincoln councils.

Chairperson of the committee drawing up the joint local plan, Cllr Marion Brighton OBE, said: "Having arranged these 12 events for people to attend, learn more and engage directly in the Local Plan process, I hope that people will now use the coming week to formulate their thoughts and submit their comments based on what they have seen, heard and read.

"While we are not yet discussing specific sites or numbers, whether it be for development growth or protection, we are seeking to set the framework of the Plan, into which everything else will fit, and that must be right and responsive.

"That is why it is so important for people to engage, both at this early stage and throughout, so that they are a part of the process, rather than being apart from it.

"Once set, these will be the policies which will guide the development of Central Lincolnshire for the next 20 years or more, so please don't let this opportunity go by

Producing the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan – at a glance guide

What is it?

It is a planning policy document that local planning authorities are required to produce. It is used to guide such things as the location of new homes, the creation of new jobs and the protection of open spaces and against which planning applications will be determined. It must be in accordance with National Planning Policy Framework (the NPPF).

What area does it cover?

The Local Plan will cover all of North Kesteven District to the south of Lincoln, the City of Lincoln and all of West Lindsey District to the north of Lincoln, a total of 820 square miles.

Who will produce the document?

The Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning committee partner councils of the City of Lincoln, North Kesteven, West Lindsey and Lincolnshire County. There is a small Core Local Plan Team of officers. The Core Team will be supported by other officers from across the four authorities and by other organisations and agencies that will provide information and evidence to the Core Team at various stages.

When will the document be produced?

A Local Plan, with supporting evidence, will be produced between now and the end of 2016.

How will the document be adopted?

The Local Plan has to be examined by an independently appointed planning inspector. It is estimated that the Local Plan will be submitted to the planning Inspectorate in spring 2016 for an Examination in Public in summer 2016 with adoption by the Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee by the end of 2016.



Chance to have a say on draft Local Plan

The first draft of a new Local Plan to guide the location and development of housing, jobs, shops and schools over the next 20 years is now available for public comment.

As one of the earliest stages in setting out the forward vision for growth in Central Lincolnshire through to 2036, this initial consultation is an essential opportunity for residents, businesses and organisations to comment on the overarching methodology behind the policies which will guide the way planning applications are considered by the councils covering North Kesteven, West Lindsey and the City of Lincoln.

From now until November 11 people can review the draft local plan for Central Lincolnshire and formally write and email their comments to guide the plan's ongoing development. This will be the first of three rounds of consultation.

The Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee is developing the joint plan to co-ordinate where, when, how and to what extent growth takes place across the three areas and how this will be supported by new and improved infrastructure.

Growth is needed to accommodate an increased need for homes as the people live longer, are more likely to live alone or in smaller family units and move around more, attracted

to the area for work, retirement, education and quality of life. The framework within which the policies for growth will be shaped includes the concepts of:

- A settlement hierarchy targeting most growth in and around Lincoln, Sleaford and Gainsborough, with names villages and market towns further down the list
- No specific allocation of sites suited to fewer than 25 homes
- A pro-growth plan, with protection for sensitive landscape, heritage and conservation areas
- Infrastructure delivery of roads, schools, shops, utilities, healthcare etc running alongside principle housing and employment development
- There being no delineated village boundaries going forward.

The Preliminary Draft Local Plan is available to view at each partner authority – North Kesteven District Council, West Lindsey District Council, City of Lincoln Council and Lincolnshire County Council from October 1 and also on their websites. Comments will be welcomed in writing and online.

Where you can have your say

Consultation events are being held for people to have their say on the Local Plan.

Views are being sought on the overarching policies which will shape how future planning applications are decided in the areas of North Kesteven, City of Lincoln and West Lindsey.

Give your views on the approach to finding sites

At this Preliminary Draft Local Plan stage, we're not consulting on specific sites for development.

Instead, we want your comments on the approach we intend to take to find and allocate sites and see if you agree with this.

The next consultation on the draft Local Plan, due in mid-2015, will have proposed sites included and you will have the opportunity to make comments on them at that stage.

During the current consultation process you will see details of how sites for development will be allocated. If you disagree with the method being proposed to find and allocate sites then please let us know.

Over winter this year and spring 2015 we will be appraising all sites that are suggested during the consultation period.

While no sites are proposed for any settlement at this stage, the Preliminary Draft Local Plan does contain some important principles which give a good indication of what is likely to be allocated.

Three important elements are included:

- A draft 'settlement hierarchy' policy, which lists all settlements with more than approximately 50 residents into a level in the hierarchy
- A 'principle' that only sites capable of accommodating more than 25 homes or of a size 0.5ha or above will be allocated in the final plan

- A 'principle' not to have a settlement boundaries in the new Local Plan. Instead, a more flexible approach will be taken to enable the organic natural growth of our settlements, especially more rural ones.

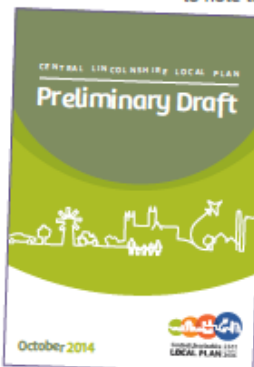
It is likely that no sites will be allocated for development in small villages but it is important to note that your settlement might move

up the hierarchy following consultation, your settlement might already have a site of more than 25 homes/0.5ha with planning permission and even if your settlement does not have any allocations, it doesn't mean that no new development will take place there. Smaller scale proposals may well be suitable and these will be determined through the planning application process and tested against the criteria-based policies in the Local Plan.

If you have land you want allocated for development, please let us know during this first consultation period. A special form

can be found on our website: www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/central-lincolnshire/

Even if you have let us know in the past, you should let us know again so we are aware that you are still interested in having your land allocated. If you don't own a site but think it would be a good location for development or you think a site shouldn't be allocated for development then please let us know, including the reasons why, using the website address above.



So what happens next?

This round of consultation is your first opportunity to have your say on the Local Plan.

As a minimum you will have an opportunity to comment on two further draft Local Plans, scheduled to be published over 2015 and 2016. You may also have an opportunity to present your concerns to an independent inspector in 2016, before any decision is reached.

If you've made a comment throughout this first consultation period you will be notified when we've received it.

If you haven't had confirmation by January 1, 2015 please let us know and we will check that your comments have been received and

logged properly. All comments we receive will be uploaded on to our consultation portal.

Your comments will not, therefore, be treated as confidential.

We will then prepare a 'Key Issues Raised' document which will capture the key messages received about the Local Plan, which will be broken down policy by policy.

Due to time and resource constraints, responses won't be sent to individuals. Instead, comments will be grouped with those making similar or opposing points about a particular aspect of the plan and then it will be determined if the plan should be amended or not.

With so much happening every week to progress the emerging strategies being drawn up to direct the growth of Central Lincolnshire, the best place to be is online.

What is it?

It is a planning policy document that local planning authorities are required to produce. It is used to guide such things as the location of new homes, the creation of new jobs and the protection of open spaces and against which planning applications will be determined.

What area does it cover?

The Local Plan will cover all of North Kesteven District to the south of Lincoln, the City of Lincoln and all of West Lindsey District to the north of Lincoln, a total of 820 square miles.

Who will produce the document?

The Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee partner councils of the City of Lincoln, North Kesteven, West Lindsey and Lincolnshire County. There is a small Core Local Plan Team of officers. The Core Team will be supported by other officers from across the four authorities and by other organisations and agencies that will provide information and evidence to the Core Team at various stages.

When will the document be produced?

A Local Plan, with supporting evidence, will be produced between now and the end of 2016.

How will the document be adopted?

The Local Plan has to be examined by an independently appointed planning inspector. It is estimated that the Local Plan will be submitted to the planning inspectorate in spring 2016 for an Examination in Public. In summer 2016 with adoption by the Central Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee by the end of 2016.



Crucial year ahead for Central Lincolnshire's 'blueprint' of the future!

Work on adopting the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan by 2016 is on track – despite a slight change to the consultation timetable.

The overall submission date will not be affected and residents will have plenty of time to have their say on the vital plans before they are sent off.

As previously reported, the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan Committee is responsible for producing the blueprint.

The committee is made up of councillors and officers from the City of Lincoln, West Lindsey, North Kesteven District Council and Lincolnshire County Council, which makes up Central Lincolnshire.

Chairman of the committee, Cllr Jeff Summers, explained the plan will help with development control across the area as well as opportunities and policies on what will or will not be permitted and where.

Cllr Summers said: "When complete the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan will provide a cross-border integrated strategy for all our future structural needs for the three districts. This will include housing, economic development and infrastructure."

The second round of consultation for the Local Plan will take place between October and November 2015.

It was moved by two months to allow the consideration of the additional evidence from the National and census data.

All local plans are required to have the latest available data relating to population and economic growth.

Members of the committee also considered feedback from previous consultations regarding the timing.

Parish councils expressed difficulty in suitably reviewing and responding to consultations during peak holiday periods.

As a result, members agreed to move the consultation from the summer period.

Copies of the new document will also be available during September, allowing people more time to consider the report prior to making their official representations.

Cllr Summers urged people to save the dates in their calendars to make sure people express their views on the proposed developments.

He added: "As the new chairman of the Central Lincolnshire Joint Planning Committee I am well aware of the importance of the next 12 months. However, I can report we are on target to complete for submission in 2016 but please make sure you have your say!"

The overall submission date will not be affected and residents will have plenty of time to have their say on the vital plans before they are sent off.

As previously reported, the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan Committee is responsible for producing the blueprint. The committee is made up of councillors and officers from the City of Lincoln, West Lindsey, North Kesteven District Council and Lincolnshire County Council, which makes up Central Lincolnshire.

Chairman of the committee, Cllr Jeff Summers, explained the plan will help with development control across the area as well as opportunities and policies on what will or will not be permitted and where.

Cllr Summers said: "When complete the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan will provide a cross-border integrated strategy for all our future structural needs for the three districts. This will include housing, economic development and infrastructure."

The second round of consultation for the Local Plan will take place between October and November 2015.

It was moved by two months to allow the consideration of the additional evidence from the National and census data.

All local plans are required to have the latest available data relating to population and economic growth.

Members of the committee also considered feedback from previous consultations regarding the timing.

Parish councils expressed difficulty in suitably reviewing and responding to consultations during peak holiday periods.

As a result, members agreed to move the consultation from the summer period.

Copies of the new document will also be available during September, allowing people more time to consider the report prior to making their official representations.

Cllr Summers urged people to save the dates in their calendars to make sure people express their views on the proposed developments.

He added: "As the new chairman of the Central Lincolnshire Joint Planning Committee I am well aware of the importance of the next 12 months. However, I can report we are on target to complete for submission in 2016 but please make sure you have your say!"

"It's important that everyone has an opportunity to shape the future of Central Lincolnshire and engaging in the consultation process is a key part of this."

"Whether you are a parish council, local resident, an employer or developer – whatever your connection to Central Lincolnshire – we want to hear from you!"

Public engagement to discover more detail of the vision outlined for the development and growth of Central Lincolnshire through to 2036 continues throughout October.

Feedback is welcomed during six weeks of consultation on the Draft Local Plan guiding the location and development of housing, jobs, shops and schools over the next 25 years.

The Central Lincolnshire plan will co-ordinate where, when, how and to what extent growth takes place across North Kesteven, West Lindsey and the City of Lincoln, supported by new and improved roads, schools and employment opportunities.

Overall the plan, which covers 2012 to 2036, seeks to preserve and enhance what is special about the area - such as our landscape, picturesque towns, villages and the magnificent city - but make it an even better place to:

- Live** - with quality homes people can afford, easier access to shops, services and facilities, and thriving new communities that are welcoming and safe
- Work** - where new facilities and infrastructure mean that businesses choose to expand or relocate here, bringing jobs and added investment
- Visit** - a place where people come to enjoy our nature, history, shops, eateries and attractions, while at the same time significantly contributing to our economy

There is an annual growth target of 1,540 homes per year across the 820 square miles of Central Lincolnshire over the 25-year period, of which 9,065 (24.6%) have already been built or been given permission. There will be substantial provision of affordable homes, up to half of the target. The Draft Local Plan includes sites for allocation to meet the growth targets set out and the methodology used to put forward these potential areas. It also highlights land proposed for protection from development.

Within North Kesteven, most of the growth is planned to be in urban extensions close to Bracebridge Heath, North Hykeham, Skeaford and to the west of Lincoln, with limited growth in villages. There are caps on growth in smaller villages, unless communities call for more growth than is planned.

Alongside this there are policies to ensure that the infrastructure needed to support this target - roads, schools, healthcare and other amenities - is planned for.

It is important people take a look at the sites allocated as potential places for housing, employment and other uses and those areas that identified to be protected from development; seeing the bigger picture of what is proposed and when and with the infrastructure to support it.

There is a clear methodology underlying all of the proposals, the choice of sites and the criteria used to assess them - all with a view to supporting and creating stronger, more vibrant and thriving communities.

Central Lincolnshire Draft Local Plan broken down into bite-sized chunks:

- Total housing growth - 36,960 over 25 years
- Annual target across Central Lincolnshire - 1,540, 725 of them proposed as affordable
- Already approved or built - 9,085 houses
- Housing growth is needed to support projected jobs growth and population change and to maintain existing services
- Infrastructure needs are built into the vision - new schools, roads, doctors etc
- 44% of overall growth, 16,300 homes planned for the edges of Lincoln, Sleaford & Gainsborough
- Sleaford projected to take around 12% of total homes, 3,000-plus in two new large estates
- Similar number proposed for north of District between Canwick and Bracebridge Heath
- 138 hectares allocated as key employment sites - around half of it in NK at North Hykeham, Witham St Hughes, Sleaford and the city edge near Skellingthorpe.
- Jobs creation projected at 11,894.
