I make the following points for the Inspectors attention.

- 1. The pocket of land between Larkspur Road and Hurstwood Close was designated as a place of Important open Space in the Central Lincolnshire Local Plan of 2012 as a Green Wedge. This surely has not changed since that date and even the proposed changes state that these open spaces deliver a wealth of benefits to the local community and are important to the settlements in which they are located. (MM28 5.8.3) This land is important to the local community and I urge the Inspector to reconsider and keep this area as a Green Wedge.
- 2. As far as the Boundary is concerned between King Georges Field and the pocket of land between Larkspur Road and Hurstwood Close this has always been the case that it was separated by a fence and trees and is an IMPORTANT OPEN SPACE. This has not changed over the years since the original plan was put in place and subsequently was not seen as needing a change in 2012. Just because a developer has decided to present a plan to build on this land after 25 years plus is not in my mind a reason to alter the boundary. I strongly object to this boundary being changed.
