Leasingham and Roxholm Neighbourhood Plan Referendum - Information Statement

A neighbourhood planning referendum will be held for the Leasingham and Roxholm Neighbourhood Plan on Thursday 9 November 2023. The question asked in the referendum will be:

'Do you want North Kesteven District Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Leasingham and Roxholm to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

The referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Leasingham and Roxholm Neighbourhood Plan area and covers the parish of Leasingham and Roxholm.

A person is entitled to vote in the referendum if on 9 November 2023 he or she is registered as a local government elector within the referendum area.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the referendum is £3,151.42. The number of persons entitled to vote in the referendum by reference to which the limit has been calculated is 1,339.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
